Who are Healthwatch Darlington?

Healthwatch Darlington Limited is your independent consumer champion for health and social care in Darlington. We help to shape and improve local health and social care in your community.

We are a part of the Healthwatch national network, established by the Government to ensure local patients and users have a greater input to shaping and designing local services.

What we do:

- Enable local voices to influence the delivery design of local health and social care services
- Empower Health Connector volunteers to gather views and experiences from local people
- Involve and engage local people, putting YOU at the heart of Health and Social Care service decision making
- Enable local people to make informed choices about their own, their families and friends' health and social care
- Influence the way services are planned, designed, commissioned and delivered
- Have strong relationships with Health and Social Care commissioners and providers as a critical friend using community views to influence and improve planning and delivery of services
- Provide information and support about local services and signpost to them

What roles do we offer?

Health Connectors can volunteer in any of our roles which fall into three categories; **Observer**, **Community** or Strategic and are not limited to one role. This means you can learn new things and enjoy new experiences throughout your time with us. We care about our Health Connectors and understand that flexibility is really important so you choose when to give your time.

Community

Outreach Representative

To extend the reach of Healthwatch Darlington through outreach activities. Assisting the Volunteer & Outreach Coordinator at Access Points and events in the community. Communicating with a wide range of local people discussing health & social care services and providing information and signposting. Promote Healthwatch Darlington and raise awareness of how we can help local people through ensuring they have a voice when it comes to local services.

Social Media Volunteer

Engage with local people via social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter and Hootsuite. Provide assistance in updating social media platforms with interactive and interesting posts to increase followers and maintain existing followers. Promote Healthwatch Darlington and activities through social media to extend the reach of Healthwatch into the community.

Youthwatch

Local Children and Young People (CYP) can volunteer as Health Connectors who extend the reach of the Healthwatch Darlington team and support CYP to connect with the health and social care services they need.



Observer

Enter & View Representative

The law allows authorised representatives of Healthwatch Darlington to enter, view & observe health and social care services. Health Connectors can undertake training in order to become representatives.

Mystery Shopper

To conduct mystery shopping exercises within local community health services such as pharmacies and opticians. Gather information in order to develop small reports which will include findings and recommendations that can be given to service providers.

Strategic

Meeting and Network Representatives

Attending meetings and network groups on behalf of Healthwatch Darlington acting as a representative. Sharing information and news on behalf of HWD whilst reporting back any relevant and important information we need to know.

Report & Research Writer

To support the Healthwatch Team to deliver robust, valid and reliable research reports and to ensure that strong evidence and research influences the organisation's priorities and actions.

As well as the above roles we also look for volunteers to support with general administration within the Healthwatch Darlington office as and when this arises.
