Arcus is a counselling and social support service, primarily developed for LGBT+ people, but services are open to anyone. Their counselling service is offered free to anyone who is on benefits or a low income. They offer a mixture of therapy approaches including Cognitive Behaviour Therapy [CBT] and Person-Centred Counselling. They also run Arcus forum for members of LGBT+ community. Working in collaboration with Alzheimer's Society and Age UK North Yorkshire & Darlington, there is an Older LGBT+ Person's Social Group at Bradbury House, Beaumont Street West, Darlington. Every Thursday 4pm-6pm.

Support in a carer emergency is available to all unpaid carers who care for an adult. The Duty Officer will ask you for information about the person you care for and check if there are any family or friends who can assist. If not, they may be able to arrange for support to be provided.

Please note, the person you care for may be required to contribute to the cost of the care provided, in line with the Council's charging policy.

The Duty Officer will discuss this with you, if a service is to be provided.

The district nursing service offers a comprehensive portfolio of nursing, healthcare, and case management services to housebound patients (in your own home or residential nursing home) requiring nursing support in the community 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In response to identified health needs, the service offers nursing treatments, disease prevention, promotion of health, independence and self-care.

A Safe and Wellbeing Visit is a totally free service offered by County Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue Service. If you contact the service, they will arrange a mutually convenient appointment for trained Fire and Rescue Service staff to do a personalised fire hazard assessment of your home. They will fit free smoke alarms where required and offer advice to make you safer in your home.

Their service provides: information and advice, access to grants and funding, free telephone counselling sessions, carers meetings, carers training, carer break funding, and advice and support to help you access benefits.

Lifeline gives you the freedom to live independently, and the security of knowing that you can always get help when you need it. A small pendant can be worn, which if you have a fall, you can press a button which will alert people that you need help. Darlington Lifeline provides a local service which means you can call for help 24 hours a day.

Telecare is a range of simple, light, easy to use pieces of equipment for use within the home, to support people to be as independent as possible e.g., falls detectors, bed sensors.

Darlington Mind is a registered local charity that provides professional, confidential support and recovery services for people experiencing emotional or mental health problems and their carers. They offer a wide range of support and recovery services to meet the needs of different people. Some of their services include counselling, befriending calls and support, bereavement support as well as other activities to help with positive mental health.

RIACT is a Short Intervention Service for people:

- over the age of 18
- who live within the Borough of Darlington and/or are registered with a Darlington GP practice, and;
- are "medically fit" (which means they do not need a hospital bed and their health needs can be met in the community).





RIACT involves local health, social care and mental health services working together, along with the independent and voluntary sector. It aims to provide assessments, short-term rehabilitation and support to help people become more independent. This service is free of charge. Depending on your needs, it is available from as little as 1-2 days up to a maximum period of 6 weeks.
