Together with the North East England Chamber of Commerce and the North East Child Poverty Commission, VONNE has stated there is an urgent need to address growing levels of child poverty: "If government is serious about its levelling up agenda, this requires concerted action to make sure children and young people in our region can access opportunities and have the same life chances as anyone else."

PM promises VCSE sector more support over the winter

The Prime Minister has promised to do “much more to support the voluntary sector” over the winter as coronavirus pandemic continues.

Boris Johnson was responding to a question in the House of Commons this week from Rachael Maskell, the shadow charities minister. She said: "Charities have been never more needed. As fundraising opportunities have dried up and retail stores have been closing down, charities are predicted to have a £10bn deficit and yet are providing more and more services."

She added: "It is time the Prime Minister recognised the considerable contribution of the sector – which has stepped in like never before during this pandemic."

Funders pledge renewed support to charities ahead of second lockdown

One hundred funders have signed a renewed pledge to support the charity sector ahead of the lockdown starting today in England. They are committing to listen to the needs of communities and civil society, learning about ways in which charities and funders can better work together, and making sure funding supports charities and communities for the long-term.

The pledge is called 'still standing with the sector', and follows the original 'we stand with the sector' pledge, which was launched by London Funders in March and went on to gather more than 400 signatures from funders across the UK.

NCVO's Covid-19 impact barometer findings summarised

The National Council for Voluntary Organisations' (NCVO) first monthly Voluntary Sector Impact Barometer, developed in partnership with Nottingham Trent University, Sheffield Hallam University and funded by the Economic and Social Research Council has revealed:

- The financial position of two in five (39 per cent) of voluntary organisations has deteriorated in the last month
- 56 per cent expect demand for their services to increase over the next month
- 60 per cent said Covid-19 safety measures have increased operating costs
- 80 per cent anticipate Covid-19 to negatively impact the delivery of planned

objectives over the next 12 months

- 10 per cent expect they are likely to have stopped operating by this time next year
- 92 per cent report an increase in online service delivery delivering their services online.

£1.4m fund launched to boost access to services and activities during Covid-19

Charities have been invited to apply to a £1.4m fund that will enable them to make key services more accessible through the ongoing coronavirus pandemic.

The [Increasing Access Fund](#), created by the Peter Sowerby Foundation, is intended to benefit people that have struggled to access key services and activities during Covid-19, due to lockdown measures or the organisations' inability to deliver services in a Covid-secure way.

Funds will support charities to develop digital services, or adapt their delivery of existing services, to comply with social distancing or other Covid-19 response measures.

Survey results reveal village halls are vital to our social fabric

Earlier this year, more than 2,000 village halls took part in the National Village Halls Survey 2020, which provides a detailed snapshot of the operations and management of community buildings across the country and is taken every 10 years.

An astonishing 60 per cent of respondents stated that their halls are the only meeting place for their community, with activities such as coffee mornings and luncheon clubs helping to address loneliness among vulnerable groups. The 2020 survey results clearly confirm village halls occupy a special place in the social fabric of local communities and make a significant contribution to the economy.

The Community Anchors' Fund has reopened

The Virgin Money Foundation is reopening its Community Anchors' Fund.

Community Anchors are those vital community organisations working in local neighbourhoods that have been at the heart of the local response to the pandemic, ensuring vulnerable people received essential supplies of food, fuel, data and human contact.

The relaunched Community Anchors' Fund will provide flexible grants of between £10,000 and £30,000 to organisations in the North East, to cover core costs, to continue to pay for existing work, or to design and launch a new activity. The award can be spread over one, two or three years.

Applications will be assessed as part of a rolling grants programme. The foundation wants to encourage applications from organisations working in Middlesbrough, Stockton and Darlington.

New report highlights Covid-19's impact on the region's most vulnerable

VONNE has been working with Public Health England and North Cumbria and the North East Applied Research Collaborative (ARC) to look at the direct and indirect impact of Covid-19 on our most vulnerable groups.

The rapid research found that funding is the most critical issue facing the VCSE sector, and the threats with the greatest potential to increase health inequalities are digital exclusion, funding bodies prioritising Covid-19 at the expense of other areas of need, and the withdrawal of services that are often the only source of support for the most vulnerable people.

However, positive outcomes included finding new ways of using technology to deliver services and increased partnership working and new collaborations.

#DoYourBit on flu - think pharmacy, GP and 111 first

Health leaders across the North East are asking people to do their bit this winter by thinking pharmacy, GP and 111 first, and not just to turn up to A&E.

The plea is part of the region's #DoYourBit campaign, aimed at raising awareness of the first routes people should take for urgent medical advice and treatment.

A&E departments are under more pressure than usual due to social distancing and infection control precautions, minimising the space available to care for people and work safely. So with the number of Covid infections rising and winter fast approaching, the NHS is asking people to use services sensibly and keep A&E for those who need it most.

Report demands reform to close gaps in society

People who face discrimination are at the sharp end of inequality and poverty and the pandemic has brought these inequalities into sharp focus. Our colleagues at Connected Voice Advocacy supported the development of a survey of 435 advocates working across England and Wales that was carried out in June 2020.

The resulting [Valuing Voices](#) report brings together findings from the survey, which expose systemic flaws in health and social care, and demands a rethink in our approach.

New report into diversity and inclusion in VCSE leadership

A new joint report by the Institute for Public Policy Research (IPPR) and the Runnymede Trust calls on the government to take urgent action to prevent Covid-19 running along racial lines again.

The report says that despite the inequalities exposed earlier this year, there has been little effort to stop Covid-19 hitting minority ethnic communities hardest as we enter the second national lockdown.

If you identify as LGBTQ+ and have experienced any form of homelessness while aged 16-25 within the last five years, akt wants to hear about your experiences. Findings from the survey will be used to help support vulnerable LGBTQ+ young people that are facing or experiencing homelessness.

VONNE round up

Over the past few weeks VONNE has:

- Supported the VONNE Climate Action Alliance to take part in the Catalyst Discovery Programme to explore how digital tools can engage more broadly and support regional VCSE organisations with climate action.

- Met with the North East LEP and North of Tyne Combined Authority to discuss the need for regional leadership and a joined up strategy to address digital exclusion as part of Covid-19 recovery plans.
- Held a roundtable discussion with 15 VCSE organisations to help shape a potential digital skills training programme for the sector.
- Represented the sector at weekly meetings of the LA7 Covid-19 Strategic Coordination Group of the Local Resilience Forum, feeding back intelligence to a range of statutory organisations.
- Brought together social prescribing & green agenda partners across the North East and North Cumbria (NENC) to collaborate on an expression of interest to the national green social prescribing programme on behalf of our NENC Integrated Care System.
- Delivered a training session to Newcastle University staff on how to work with the North East voluntary, community and social enterprise sector.

New North East centre to address the challenges of digital citizenship

A new £9m research centre that will allow citizens across the country to grasp the possibilities of the digital revolution has been announced for our region.

The Centre for Digital Citizens (CDC), led by Newcastle and Northumbria Universities, will explore how digital technologies can support areas such as public health and wellbeing, community engagement, citizen safety and technology-enhanced lifelong learning.

Broadband voucher scheme for our digital borderlands

The Gigabit Voucher scheme offers business and residents in some of the hardest to reach places in the UK additional funding towards the cost of installing gigabit-capable broadband to their premises when part of a group project via the Government's Rural Gigabit Connectivity programme.

This scheme provides between £500 and £3,500 per small and medium-sized businesses (SME) and between £500 and £1,500 per resident to support the cost of installing new gigabit-capable connections.

Digital Borderlands funding is a 'top-up' to the Government's Rural Gigabit Connectivity Voucher Scheme. Subject to criteria, this scheme has the potential to double the value of the voucher awarded.

Rural premises in Cumbria and Northumberland experiencing speeds below 30 megabits per second (Mbps) are eligible.

Funding is time-limited and must be committed under the schemes before they close on March 31st next year. Suppliers are becoming very busy as a result of interest, so communities must have an agreed plan in place with their chosen supplier by this date to be considered.
