National recognition for the impact of Covid-19 on the VCSE sector

Following our [report compiling the results of our region-wide survey](#) last month, over the last couple of weeks, VONNE and the wider VCSE sector in the region have seen both local and national media interest in the ongoing impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on our sector.

Last week, our CEO Carol Botten put several of our members in touch with ITN and was interviewed for the breakfast shows on both BBC Radio Newcastle and Radio Tees; and on Monday this week, appeared on ITV News Tyne Tees to talk about the situation in light of the cancellation of this year's Great North Run. The survey report has also been featured in [The Northern Echo](#), on [ChronicleLive](#), [Great Britain News](#), and in [Newcastle Magazine](#), while [The Guardian](#) has warned that up to 10 per cent of charities nationally may face bankruptcy due to Covid-19, and [Civil Society News](#) predicts a £10bn funding gap in the next six months.

1,500 free National Fundraising Convention places available to small charity staff

The Institute of Fundraising has announced it is offering 1,500 free places at its National Fundraising Convention to individuals from small charities.

The three-day event takes place from July 6th, with more than 80 development sessions and networking opportunities available. Eligible individuals are those working for organisations with an income of between £1 million and £2.5 million.

Applications opened on Monday (June 15th), closing on June 26th, and are being offered on a first come, first served basis.

Report into financial inequality and mental health in light of Covid-19

A briefing from the 'Coronavirus: Mental Health in the Pandemic' Study has been published by the Mental Health Foundation.

It states that those who face the greatest disadvantages in society also face the greatest risk to their mental health, with the distribution of infections and deaths during the pandemic, the lockdown and associated measures, and the longer-term socioeconomic impact likely to reproduce and intensify the financial inequalities that contribute towards the increased prevalence and unequal distribution of mental ill-health.

Psychological first aid training available for essential workers

Public Health England has launched a free, online psychological first aid training course aimed at all frontline and essential workers and volunteers.

The 90-minute course aims to increase awareness and confidence to provide psycho-social support to people affected by Covid-19. Psychological first aid is globally recognised for use in emergency situations and this new course has been developed as part of the national incident response by Public Health England, in partnership with NHS England, Health Education England, FutureLearn and E-Learning for Health.

No previous qualifications are required and the course is also available in three sessions for the learner to complete at their own pace.

Over the past couple of weeks VONNE has:

'Tech for Good' VCSE support available in North East

Our recent North East VCSE Sector Covid-19 impact survey highlighted that 30 per cent of organisations require more support with homeworking software, digital and communications tools and technology to help them more effectively deliver services and support to beneficiaries.

In response, VONNE has been working with international technology firm Accenture to leverage more support to the region's VCSE sector from its Tech for Good group, which coordinates requests from charities, social enterprises and community organisations seeking IT, tech and digital support from experienced volunteers.

Policies and procedures

Having safeguarding policies is crucial to keep people safe. But arguably more important is the thinking that goes behind them. An effective policy is a live document, updated and brought before your Board of Trustees for approval regularly.

Your policy should set out your commitment to keeping people safe, demonstrating that you understand the potential risks to people using your services, and the relevant legislation, outlining how your procedures will help keep people safe, and who in the organisation is responsible for safeguarding, as well as how to report and respond to disclosures.

You should also think about how to embed your policy into practice and bring safeguarding into the day to day through safer recruitment, relevant training, and the implementation of a code of conduct.
