## A final reminder to use your *Workspace Finder* credits

## What the cabinet reshuffle means for the VCSE sector

As part of the recently announced cabinet reshuffle, charity policy is now the responsibility of Nadine Dorries MP, the new secretary of state for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), who replaces Oliver Dowden, who was made Conservative Party chairman.

Meanwhile, Danny Kruger MP, who led the government-commissioned review of civil society last year, has joined the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, and former charities minister Baroness Barran has become academies minister.

## Regional news

### Investment boost for the South of our region

South Tyneside, the Tees Valley and County Durham have been selected by *Arts Council England* as among 54 national 'priority places' as part of its vision for creativity and culture to help people thrive within healthier and happier lives.

Recognising its past investment in these locations has so far been too low, these hot spots will receive a level of focus designed to help them play a key role in levelling up across the North.

### Community energy: what will enable successful development?

*VONNE* has worked with the *North East LEP*, *North of Tyne Combined Authority*, *Durham County Council*, *South Tyneside Council* and *Community Energy England* to produce a report to understand why the North East has the lowest concentration of community energy projects in the UK.

It's widely acknowledged that achieving net zero will require individuals, communities and businesses to think differently about how they heat their buildings, power their transport and generate their power. However, it is less well understood how we will bring about those changes, and community energy groups offer one pathway.

## Developments at *MEA House*

VONNE [Membership+](#) supporter *MEA House*, from which VONNE is also based, is in the process of improving its connectivity on the building's ground and fifth floors, with fibre broadband, wall-mounted TV screens with an HDMI lead and cameras, so meetings can be conducted both in person and remotely at the same time.

## *The Community Anchors' Fund* is open for applications

*The Community Anchors' Fund* from the *Virgin Money Foundation* provides flexible grants of between £10k and £30k to cover core costs, pay for existing work or to design and launch a new activity.

Community Anchors are those vital, go to community organisations working in local neighbourhoods, providing support, services, activities and volunteering opportunities shaped by local people of all ages, genders and ethnicities.

Awards can be spread over one, two or three years and all applications are assessed as part of a rolling programme. The foundation particularly wants to encourage applications from organisations working in Middlesbrough, Stockton and Darlington.

## Up to £1,500 on offer for grassroots organisations

*TK Access Solutions' Community Fund* awards grants to North East-based groups and organisations that inspire teamwork and innovation.

Open to grassroots clubs, Ofsted registered educational providers, community and not for profit groups and social enterprises, applications must be submitted online by Monday, to be voted for by the public.

The 23 applicants with the most votes will be awarded a grant, with the project with the most votes receiving £1,500, followed by a second prize of £750, a third prize of £500 and 20 awards of £250.

Members of the Inequalities in Health Alliance (IHA), a coalition of non-profit organisations committed to improving health in the UK, have written to the Prime Minister calling for a clearly defined, cross-government strategy to tackle health inequalities.


